Pre-Fair

Paperwork deadlines

- Enrollment dates (Jan. 31 and April 30)
- Weigh in paperwork required
 - Feb Steer weigh in—
 - Eslips needed for purchased animals from the producer
 - Proof of Ownership form needed for home grown animals
 - Health forms will be given out that day
 - Spring weigh in
 - Goats and Sheep need Scrapies Tags in the ears prior
 - Health Forms will be handed out that day
- Leases for Dogs and Horses (April 30)

FAIR RULES

Make sure you read the exhibitor guide rules. We are only touching on a few:

Dress....Rule #14 under Rules governing 4-H exhibits....include shooting sports and poultry dress in long sleeves for showmanship classes

When can a member be sent home?

Not following #11 Rules governing 4-H exhibits—Abuse, misconduct, etc.

Adult helping too much—The child would not be sent home, but the parent might be asked to leave the barn area or the fairgrounds if necessary for the child to be successful independently.

Not following the 4-H Code of Conduct

Not following the Oregon 4-H Animal Ethics

As deemed necessary by the 4-H Coordinator and Superintendent

When can a member lose their premiums?

If they try to take an animal home before the end of fair #9 Rules Governing 4-H

Not following the 4-H Code of Conduct

Not following the 4-H rules in the Exhibitor Guide

Don't clean their animal pens Sunday before they leave

#4 under Showing—Abusive language, unsportsmanlike, etc.

As deemed necessary by the 4-H Coordinator and Superintendent

Sick Animals/Unhealthy Animal-Refer to #20 and 21 of Animal Science Rules and #13 of Oregon State Fair rules.
