FROM the EDUCATOR

Dear 4-H Family,

I learned today the Expo has been chosen as a federal COVID vaccination site, overseen by FEMA. How wonderful for our community and our state! Everyone is eligible to receive the vaccine starting April 19. The drive through clinic (through Krouse barn) will be offered 7 days a week, for 8-10 weeks. The Pfizer vaccine has been cleared for people aged 16 and older. The Jackson County Health Department will also continue its vaccination clinic, with the Moderna vaccine, in the Padgham Pavilion Monday thru Friday. This does affect our events planned for May and June at the Expo. Spring Fair WILL happen at the Expo June 4-6, but we won't have details until May. In addition, there will be no camping at the RV Park this summer because it is housing people displaced by the fires. Please be patient as we navigate the new rules as they get released. And stay focused - this is a great time to start growing plants, and practice your sewing, baking, art and photography!

Jackson County Junior Livestock Auction Committee

This group continues to meet and is working with the COVID guidelines. As of this moment, they are planning a live and online auction simultaneously for the 2021 season. Stay tuned for final details. Youth are allowed to sell a total of 2 market animals, and 1 specialty market animal (poultry or rabbit) in one year, but no more than 1 large animal per fair.

First Year Junior Showmanship

In March the Superintendents had a meeting and discussed several things. We plan to hold Showmanship this year for all animal species. New youth to the project, ages 9-11, are eligible to register as a first year junior. All youth who showed last year for the first time, and are the 4-H age of 10 or 11 years old are considered traditional "Juniors" and should sign up for this Showmanship class.

JumpstART, a precollege art summer program at Oregon State University

This year we are offering need-based scholarships to attend our week-long camp, July 11-16. Last year we had a successful online, synchronous program with students from all over the country in attendance. We are looking to repeat this success again this summer and hope to include students participating from 4-H.

Students choose two courses from offerings such as drawing, painting, photography, digital animation, and color theory. One class takes place in the morning and the other during the afternoon. Generally, there are 10-12 students in a class, so there is time to get to know the instructors, who are all esteemed, practicing artists and educators. We have a visiting artist program with artist talks each day after lunch; this year I am excited about our roster of nationally recognized artists.

We are keeping tuition low at \$300, and moreover there are ample need-based scholarship opportunities. Need-based scholarships are first come, first served. Students should select 'free and reduced lunch eligible' during the registration to be eligible for a need-based scholarship. Scholarship deadline is June 7.
