The purpose of this class is to provide an opportunity to showcase local sheep breeders and it gives the participating 4-H and FFA showman an additional class to present their hard work and to some their yearlong breeding program products. This contest is open to all 4-H and FFA sheep exhibiters that meet the following criteria.

- ✓ Only the lambs bred, born, raised and purchased from a sheep flock in Jackson County, Oregon are eligible for this contest.
- ✓ The lambs may be either a weather, ewe or ram lamb and may be the same animal shown in the Market show or the exhibitor back up lamb can be shown as long as the above criteria is met.
- ✓ Paper registration must be completed and complete packets turned in at the May Leaders meeting 5/10/2023. NO LATE ENTRIES.
- ✓ The breeder will have to sign a Breeder Affidavit Certificate to verify the ranch of origin, the full description and age of the animal and that they have been in possession of the lamb since birth. This will be in addition to the bill of sale.
- ✓ The Breeder Affidavit Certificate is Mandatory and will be subject to review and verification by the sheep superintendents.

The following items are due at the time registration forms are submitted at the May leaders meeting. This is the first stage of verifying the origin of the animal, classes will be chosen at fair registration.

- -Photocopy of the Bill of Sale
- -Breeder Affidavit Certificate

The Breeder Affidavit forms are available from the Ewe Neek Sheep 4-H Club, your project leader and should be requested as soon as the exhibitor decides to enter the contest.
