Swine Tagging/Declarations

There is a new process for tagging your swine projects this year. All your animals will stay home, but you will need access to a camera. You will need to fill out a paper Declaration and ID form and include photos of your animal. This information MUST be to your leader before the April 15 deadline. Talk to your leader for details. The form will appear on our website under the Fairs tab in a few days.

UPDATED COVID Guidance

COVID guidance changes weekly. Right now a stable cohort size grew to 20 which is good news. 4-H is unique because it is a youth program that operates in a variety of settings, with youth and adults of all ages. Because of that, we fall under Youth Program Guidance, Higher Education Guidance and sector guidance, not K-12. Schools, sports and 4-H do share some things in common right now – that everyone has to wear a mask at all functions. Here is the official statement:

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, in alignment with the Oregon Governor's <u>executive orders</u>, and consistent with guidance from the <u>Oregon Health Authority</u> and the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, 4-H in-person activities **requires the use of face coverings** by all participants when in enclosed public and common areas and outdoor areas **where physical distancing is not easily or consistently maintained.** For more information, please review the <u>Oregon State University Face Covering policy</u>.

A young person you know could be experiencing a mental health or substance use problem. Learn an action plan to help.

Who Should Take The Course? Anyone 18 or older can take Youth Mental Health First Aid, but it is recommended for those who regularly have contact with young people ages 12-18+ - for teachers, coaches, social workers, faith leaders and other caring citizens.

THERE IS A REQUIRED ONLINE PRE-TRAINING THAT WILL BE SENT OUT THE WEEK PRIOR TO THE TRAINING, THIS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR .

Youth Mental Health First Aid USA is an 8 hour (2 - 4 hour days) public education program which introduces participants to the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention, and teaches individuals how to help an adolescent in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. Mental Health First Aid uses role-playing and simulations to demonstrate how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social, and self-help care.
