CAN WE PRACTICE INTENTIONAL CHARACTER EDUCATION?

We are constantly teaching the youth we encounter, either by what we do or by what we don't do. When we make statements like “nobody will ever know, go ahead...” or “tell them your 10, you'll get in for free...” we are clearly saying, the rules don't matter, it's ok to lie if money is involved or behave poorly if no one is watching. This lifestyle or attitude has manifested itself in small and monumental ways in our families, communities, our country and our world.

Our actions also make similar statements, a lightweight goat, just put your thumb on the scale and instantly the goat can sell. No losers here, right? What about the child that we just lowered the bar for and no longer thinks they need to try as hard? What about the packer who expects us to give them a high-quality product that we've guaranteed meets certain parameters. Sure, it's just a pound, but those boundaries are there for a reason and trust me, committees give youth all the latitude they can to help them be successful.

So, what can we do to demonstrate and teach our youth to have good character? Many things...

First, we can demonstrate good character and good decision making ourselves. We can be transparent and thoughtful in our decisions. The right choice, isn't always the easy choice. We have to make decisions for the right reasons, not just so the “noise” will stop.

We can notice when youth in our presence do something that represents good character; even the little things. Then acknowledge it! Recognize them with words, “thank you for telling the truth,” “Thank you for bringing that lost wallet to an adult...” AND tell them why, “what a great way to show your trustworthiness,” telling the truth is such an important measure of character,” and so on. This intentional teaching, cloaked in praise, is quality reinforcement for young people.

We can teach by helping youth weigh alternatives and talking through situations with them. Helping them choose the choice that demonstrates the most integrity. We can also teach by letting our youth make a poor choice and then talking and explaining why it wasn't the best choice. We constantly work to prevent our children's failures, when we might be preventing an educational opportunity. Obviously, we don't want anyone to get hurt, but sometimes learning opportunities have consequences.

Integrity, ethics, character, morals, all definitions can be skewed to mean something different. But really, we are in 4-H because we think it's “good for our kids,” right? Let's make it better for them, you know given the whole, “Make the Best Better” motto. Be an example of integrity, demonstrate good ethics, admit when we fail and make bad choices, help our youth clearly know the difference and strive to make the ethical choice. Don't ever forget, the youth in our program, are our future. Want a better county, community, country, and world to live in? It starts with **US** and quality intentional Character Education.

NO MORE OVER THE COUNTER ANTIBIOTICS

AS OF JUNE 11, 2023

Never before has it been more important to develop a relationship with your veterinarian. As of June 11, 2023, antibiotics will no longer be sold “over the counter.” Instead, a prescription will be required from a licensed veterinarian. This is being done in an effort to ensure “effective antibiotic use in humans and animals.” A pharmacist will be required to fill your veterinary prescriptions, they will no longer be available at your local farm store.

This impacts antibiotics, like: LA-200, cephalixin, gentamicin, sulfadimethoxine, and others. It does NOT affect de-wormers, fly preventatives or coccidiostats.

If you don't have a veterinarian-client-patient-relationship (known as a VCPR), it's time to work on that.

Roping Change beginning 10/2023

We will add a couple new classes of roping.

Intermediates will have two options:

1. Roping Cattle (in a pen, like seniors)
2. Roping a Simulator

Juniors will also have two options:

1. Roping a moving Simulator from horseback
2. Roping a bale on the ground.

How does this affect high points, state fair qualification?

I suggest, when calculating high points, consider scores with the more difficult roping first, if they are not a white ribbon. OR, decide what's best for your county and only use one of the options.

As for qualifying for state ranch horse: We will have both options at state fair, and you can use either roping score to qualify, but you must rope at the state contest as you did at county. High Points at state will be calculated on roping cattle scores; simulator scores will not be considered. AND remember, high point is calculated on all 6 events (not your best 5 as some thought)

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals REQUIRED for...

Youth for the quality care of animals (YQCA) will be a required certification for all livestock, horse, and small animal exhibitors at the Oregon State Fair 4-H Show, 2024. Yes, I know it's less relative to horses, but there is still important information for you too.

This gives you a year to complete the certification. We will also host some in person trainings around the state. You will bring a copy of your certificate with you to state fair or email it prior to state fair.

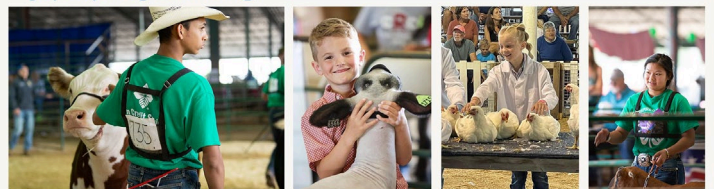
Please note: In 2024-25 4-H year, all members exhibiting livestock or small animals for food, anyone in a market class at fair, will be required to get certification. We will keep track of certifications, and everyone will be **REQUIRED** to take the training once as a junior, once as an intermediate and once as a senior.

The training takes about an hour in person and 45 minutes to an hour online. It costs \$3 +/- and is worth the time spent. I **STRONGLY** encourage the whole family to participate, not just the 4-H members.

Statewide Livestock Advisory Committee Minutes (Oct 10, 2023)

In attendance: Nicole B., Tiffanie B., Toria J., Robin B., LR B., Susan C. Nicki H., Amy F. Anne K., Dakota L., Diane K., John B., Linda B., and Candi

State Fair Debrief. Awards. Need to make all species standard. Include superintendents in getting sponsors; would like to see buckle for best female. Getting sponsors has been difficult, need help – direct sponsors to Candi or Andrea Leao. For species with small numbers, order buckles without a date – could be engraved later or not at all. Or award something small or certificate and order buckles after state fair. Also, know in advance who is planning to hand out what awards. Surprised a bit this year by OSU and being mandated to let their representative hand out all awards – this could be a problem with our actual award sponsors. Mastershowmanship. Went better this year. Communication was awesome. Need larger pen outside in order to have fewer animals outside.

Team. The superintendent and staff team was awesome. Everyone worked very well together. Seemed to go better with FFA.

Need to fix. Need more space. Candi and Lee (FFA) have already addressed this with state fair and have a few solutions. Dairy folks would like FFA dairy one day and 4-H dairy the other.

Making the barn more educational. The state fair would like to step up the barns so they are more educational for the public. Candi suggested some hands on displays, perhaps the QR code signs planned previously; reach out to dairy women and or Tami Kerr, they may have something we could use– all will require more space.

Beef area challenge. The alcohol and other challenges with open class beef were brought up. This has also been discussed with state fair. They have agreed to make some changes.

Judging. Asked Candi to connect with judges she doesn't hire and be sure they have some education on the Danish Merit System. – she agreed.

Morning Meetings. These are running a little long. Maybe only one minute to win it AND Candi needs to let all faculty know that their youth NEED/MUST attend this meeting. Perhaps tie herdsmanship score sheets to attendance. Do a knowledge bowl, drawing for those who are present, scavenger hunt, take attendance, pick up herdsmanship score sheets to know which counties attended.

Proposed market sale at state fair. Advisory group is not in favor at this time. And have asked Candi/Lee to make this decision SOON, so those purchasing steers for the show can do so. Concerns include: taking buyers away from Marion and nearby counties, details have not been provided in writing about how money is to be handled, where and how animals will be shipped, etc., where are we going to put the extra animals, will animals be back-ups or top-notch animals raised specific for state fair. Lots left to work out. Also major concern about changing the environment or “feeling” of state fair. It's competitive, but all participants are there to compete and enjoy the time, not for the check. We don't want to see that change.

State Dairy Judging Team. Dakota let us know that the Oregon Dairy Judging team won 3rd place at Nationals earning them an opportunity to travel to Scotland this summer and tour many dairies and learn about the dairy business.

Livestock Judging. Need to align awards presentation and livestock judging so awards can be given out with some recognition.

Spring Classic. Candi is putting together “Contests in a Box” That's an electronic box, so county faculty will find it easier to put on local/regional contests. We need more youth participating at Spring Classic in the livestock areas.

Other. Cable halters. Not allowing these needs to get into the state exhibitors handbook for all appropriate species. Saw several at county fairs.

Next Meeting Date. This was not set yet, but has since been set for Tuesday, April 9 at 6 pm via ZOOM.

Making the transition from “looks like” to “registration papers required” at 4-H State Fair Breed classes

Beef, Dairy Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Meat Goats

At the state fair 4-H shows, we are going to begin transitioning to requiring registration papers for breed classes. This does not mean you can't bring a crossbred to the show! **We love crossbreds too, and they will continue to have their own class.**

Breed classes will require registration papers (copies of or pending registration) in the youth, family or farm name. The parent's name, brother's name, etc. is not acceptable. You must present the papers to the superintendent when you check your classes. If the animal is leased, you must present registration papers made out in owners name and a current lease that describes the animal and length of the lease that includes state fair.

Drenching NOT allowed at 4-H county and state fairs without veterinary supervision and a necessary animal health issue.

Using “drenching” as the sole means to give your animal nutrition is not an acceptable practice. In real world livestock, we feed our animals roughage and grains, and that is the expectation of how we treat our animals at the county fair. Could the hay or grain cause a little bit of a belly that a good drench would not, possibly; but there is little risk and no negative perception of what we might be doing to our animals. If a drench gun is the only way you feed your animal – keep it home.

With that said, occasionally there is a true veterinary need to drench an animal. Under the guidance of a veterinarian, and some good common sense, like all other treatments, it would be allowed. Be sure to check in with your superintendent and/or 4-H staff member if there is a veterinary need. To be clear, withholding roughage and thus creating a veterinary need, is NOT acceptable.

Cable Halters, coated or not, are NOT allowed

This rule has been confirmed with the Advisory committee. We agree, 4-H just isn't the place for cable halters. If you want to use them as training devices that's up to you but leave them out of the show ring, please.

Brucellosis Vaccination Updates

During the 2023 Oregon Legislative Session, the legislature passed Senate Bill 57, which was signed into law by Governor Kotek on June 6, 2023. Senate Bill 57 **removed the statutory requirement for brucellosis vaccination in Oregon effective January 1, 2024.**

In response to the statutory changes brought by Senate Bill 57, the Oregon Department of Agriculture is undertaking rule making to ensure that our administrative rules match the statutory changes in SB 57. These proposed rules will be available for public comment beginning November 1, 2023. Because the changes are not effective until January 1, 2024, the Oregon Department of Agriculture must still enforce the current requirements for brucellosis vaccination. Until the changes in SB 57 take effect, female cattle over 4 months of age imported into Oregon must still be vaccinated for brucellosis. Conversely, for cattle born in Oregon during 2023, vaccination will not be required as they will reach 12 months of age (the cutoff for vaccination) after the new laws take effect January 1, 2024.

Changes to Brucellosis Vaccination

While SB 57 removes the requirement for vaccination of female cattle against *B. abortus*, it does not change the ability or process to vaccinate cattle (or bison). The brucellosis vaccine will now be an optional vaccine at the discretion of cattle owners in consultation with their veterinarian. Likewise, the vaccine will still be required to be administered by a licensed and accredited veterinarian and will require placing (or reporting of existing) official identification, and an official brucellosis tattoo.

Changes to Official Identification

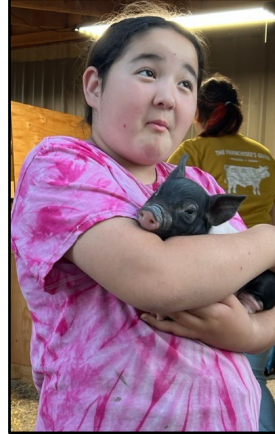
In addition to SB 57, the USDA is in the process of updating the Animal Disease Traceability rules in 9 CFR Part 86, with the intent of limiting new official identification devices used in cattle to RFID tags. While an exact timeline is not yet known, this change is anticipated to take effect during 2024. When this change takes effect, metal clip tags (bangs and bright tags) will no longer be allowed for use on newly identified cattle.

Because of the changes in SB 57, and the anticipated changes to the federal ADT rules, the Oregon Department of Agriculture will no longer have Orange RFID tags available, but instead will supply only white RFID tags for use by veterinarians. These tags can be used for any activities requiring official identification, including brucellosis vaccination. We will continue to provide metal clip “bangs” tags as long as USDA continues to supply these tags.

YQCA for All Animal Species

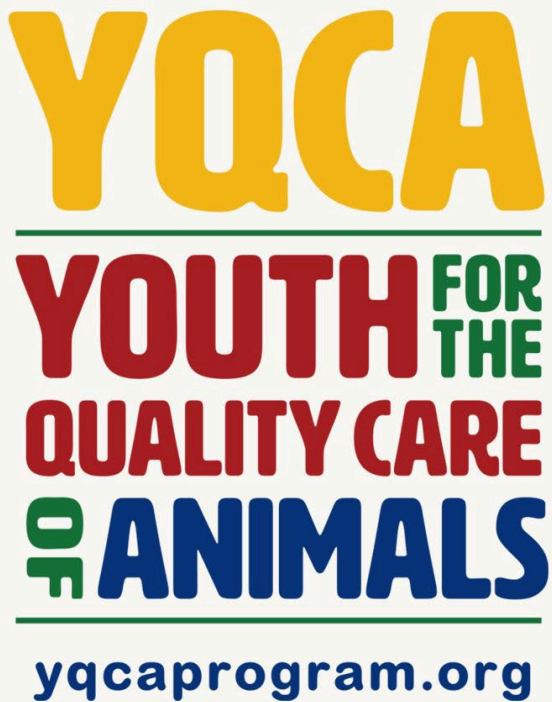
Youth for the Quality Care of Animals REQUIRED for...

This gives you a year to complete the certification. We will also host some in person trainings around the state. You will bring a copy of your certificate with you to state fair or email it prior to state fair.

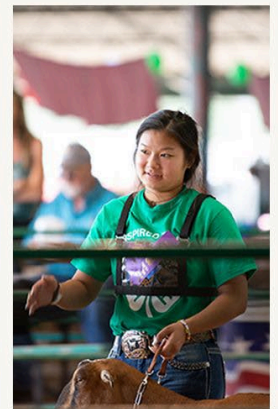
Please note: In 2024-25 4-H year, all members exhibiting livestock or small animals for food, anyone in a market class at fair, will be required to get certification. We will keep track of certifications, and everyone will be **REQUIRED** to take the training once as a junior, once as an intermediate and once as a senior.

The training takes about an hour in person and 45 minutes to an hour online. It costs \$3 +/- and is worth the time spent. I **STRONGLY** encourage the whole family to participate, not just the 4-H members.

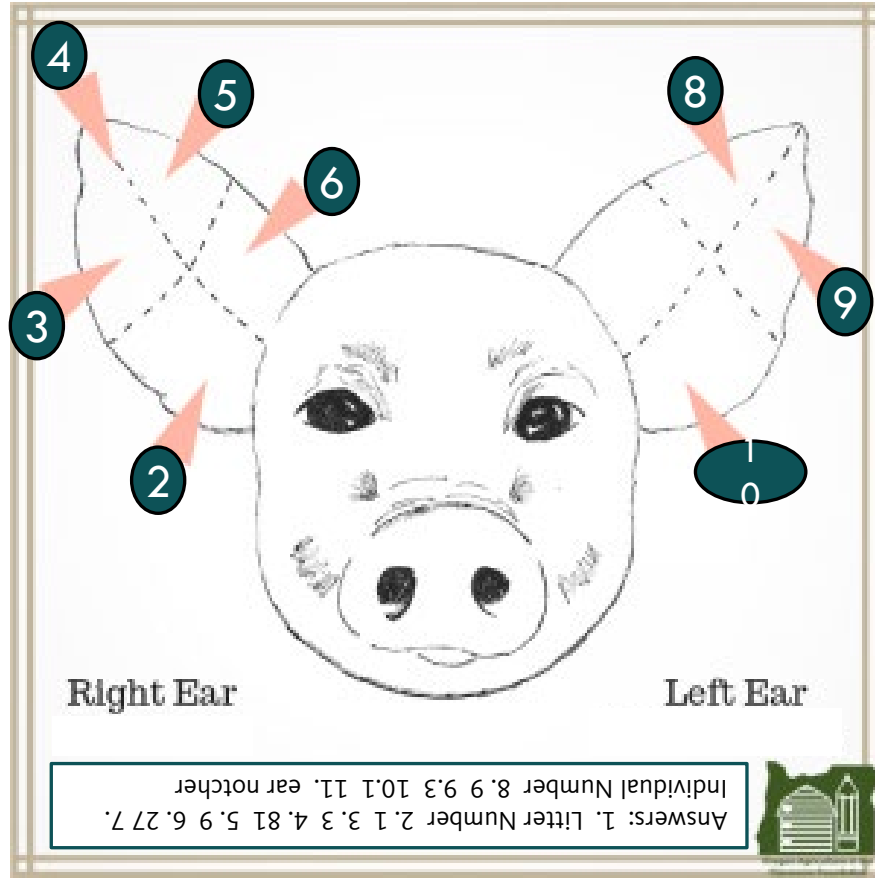
