


We can help! Come to one or more of these interactive online sessions for 4-H club leaders.

2023-2024 4-H volunteer enrollments are coming through. I am unable to approve you until you have completed the **Youth Safety Training** online. You may find this training within your 4-H online enrollment. (This is an annual process)

A Criminal History Check (CHC) is done every 2 years.

Once you have been fully enrolled, you'll receive an e-mail with instructions and a code to be able to access your club's roster through your 4-H online account.

Remember: You are not in compliance and will not be covered by insurance if you are not enrolled.



Goats 101

Covering all the basics about goats, health, and care in a "town hall" format. This class will be your gateway to the rest of the classes offered throughout the day.

Goats 102

Maintenance, hoof trimming, vaccinations, tattooing, tagging and more.

Fiber & Milk By-Products

Explore the opportunities that lie within the many by-products that you may not have considered in your goat ventures. A great class for those looking to get more from their goats.

Milking and Simple Pulse

I have a dairy goat, now what? Learn the techniques and care of milking goats with the specialists from Simple Pulse and learn how their milk machine is taking the dairy goat market by storm.

Pack Goats

Chris Parson and Chris Horn from Hermiston have been involved in the Pack Goat World for years. Join them as they host two sessions, which build on each other, on what they have found to be beneficial for the care of the pack goat, packing with goats, and equipment that they have made and use.

Cheese-Making

Cheese-making may be intimidating, but by actively preparing cheese and learning the basics, you can become confident to try at home and know the basic tools and processes.

At-Home Fecals and Deworming

How to do a fecal at home, knowing your equipment, and when and how to deworm effectively.

Market Goat Fitting and Showmanship

Covering the basics of how to start your youth market goat project, to the daily care of your animal, and ending with the day of the show tasks.

Cooking with Goat Meat

Hands-on experience with the exceptional Nora. Learn how the basics of recipes, seasoning, and preparing goat mat. You'll likely get to try a taste afterwards!

Dairy Goat Showmanship and Fitting

Reviewing the basics of choosing a goat for showmanship, training your animal, and coming prepared in the ring. We will review the scorecard, breaking down each category, and use a goat "hands-on" to better understand maneuvers and preparation.

Obstacle Course Training

Cover the basics of building a confident bond with your goat. We will explore the various obstacles that may come up in competition at your local fair.

Pregnancy Care, Ultrasounds, and Testing

Understanding the options for confirming pregnancy, completing ultrasounds at home, and managing the care and nutrition of your pregnant goats.

8 AM Registration – Show begins at 9 AM Sharp Multiple Judges, so <u>all ages be ready at 9 AM</u>

Rider's Age is as of: Sept, 1, 2023

JR: 9-11 years old INT: 12-14 years old SR: 15-18 years old

Open: Older than 9 years old

No riders/handlers under the age of 9 as of Sept 1, 2023 will be allowed to participate with a horse.

Entries

- Pre-entries postmarked by Friday, May 17: \$75 for all performance classes (1-28). An additional \$25 for all gaming classes (29-45). Or \$20 per class.
- After one family member pre-registers at a full day rate, additional family members who are preregistered may enter all eligible performance classes for \$40 and all eligible gaming classes for \$25, or \$10 per class.
- All entries received with a later postmark or at the event will be: \$100 for performance classes and \$50 for all gaming classes of which they are eligible. All family members pay the same.

Camping and Stalls

Self Contained camping is available, call 541-516-0231 and speak with Christina for reservations.

Camping: \$40/night if pre-registered

Stalls: \$10/night if pre-registered

Add \$5 to both costs if not pre-registered.

Awards

Trophies or usable items to first place – ribbons to sixth. JR, INT, SR, Open High Point awards for performance and JR, INT, SR High Point awards for gaming. *performance classes will be included for high point performance. All gaming classes will be included for high point gaming. High points are same horse/same rider. Useable items for High Point awards.

General Rules & Guidelines

Helmets are required for all 4-H members and any youth under the age of 18.

Rules in all cases where appropriate, 4-H rules apply (Contest Guide PNW 574)

Stallions are not allowed.

Conduct Expectations. This is a family event sponsored by a youth organization. Alcohol may be consumed, by those of legal age in private RVS or camp sites ONLY. The fairgrounds is a smoke free facility and therefore smoking must be contained to private vehicles.

Final Decisions. The show committee reserves the right to make final decisions regarding rule interpretations, eligibility and schedule.

Walk/Trot Equitation/Pleasure (Rider & Horse).

"Rider" indicates a rider who is comfortable only at the walk and trot. "horse" indicates a rider who has a horse that is only ready to walk and trot. While **no cross entries are allowed,** this rider may ride a different horse in other classes.

Exhibitors participating in Trail, Walk/Trot, or Working Pairs may ride either English or Western
