Jumping Pre-qualification Required for Fair

July 18th will be the pre-qualifying for jumping at county fair. Call the office to register for pre-qualifying, 426-3143. No charge for this. The pre-qualifying will be at the Horse Show that evening. If you are not planning on showing, that is fine — but you still must pre-qualify that night. We will work you into the schedule.

Members are not required to pre-qualify If they have previously pre-qualified said horse and are jumping same level. However, that horse must have been used at last year's county fair. Back up horse must still be pre-qualified.

YQCA required for State Fair Participation

New this year — Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certification will be required for all state fair animal science participants. See full article on following page.

New Horse Rule this year... Showmanship

"Showmanship is required of all contestants, AND you can only do showmanship once" (Fair Book, page 26, horse rules #16. This is now a state rule.)

It is your responsibility to read and be familiar with the 4-H rules in the Fair book and in the contest guide.

YQCA

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals

- Required for all State Fair Participants in 2024
- Required for all County Fair Participants in 2025

About

YQCA is a curriculum developed by experts across the nation to help educate youth and their families about animal husbandry, bio security, quality assurance and animal ethics. The class can be taken online for \$12. (There MAY be an in person opportunity next year)

In order to get your certificate, you and/or your family must set up an account at YQCA.org

Curriculum changes annually, so members will be expected to re-certify annually

Steps to get signed up

- 1. Go to YQCAprogram.org
- 2. Create an account
- 3. Select the training you plan to attend
- 4. Pay your fee
- 5. Take the certification
- ** 2024 State Fair Participants will need to take a copy of the certificate WITH you. This is for all animal science members, including horse, dog, small animal and livestock

Livestock

NEW – All swine members must bring Waterers

Every member will be required to bring their own pig waterer. There will NOT be water in the barn. These can be inexpensively made with the instructions below. (Also available through tack supply companies, like Sullivan Supply or Weaver, but they run about \$110.)

ALL 4H AND FFA MEMBERS WILL NOW BE REQUIRED TO BRING THEIR OWN PIG WATERERS TO FAIR THE WATER LINES AND NIPPLES HAVE BEEN REMOVED FROM ALL OF THE STALLS. THERE WILL ONLIBE WATER IN THE WASH RACKS.







6" PVC

6" CAP (IF USING PVC)

PIPE GLUE

NIPPLE KIT OR YOU CAN PURCHASE THE NIPPLE AND CONNECTOR SEPARATE

YOU CAN ALSO USE ALUMINUM PIPE AND WELD ON A COUPLING AND THEN ATTACH A NIPPLE, THEY WORK GREAT AS WELL.

THESE ARE EXAMPLES OF PIG WATERERS. THEY DO NEED TO BE THIS STYLE BUT HOW YOU GO ABOUT MAKING THEM IS UP TO YOU. YOU WILL NEED TO BRING BUNGEE CORDS OR ZIP TIES TO SECURE THEM TO YOUR STALL.

NO TROUGHS, TUBS, OR BUCKETS WILL BE ALLOWED FOR WATER AS THEY WILL MAKE A MESS IN THE BEDDING WHEN THEY GET TIPPED OVER.
